CRITERIA AND MECHANICS FOR THE NEGROS OCCIDENTAL
PROVINCIAL WILDLIFE HEADDRESS COMPETITION AND WLDLIFE FOOT PARADE COMPETITION
November 6, 2023 | Ayala Malls Capitol Central, Negros Occidental

Participant Eligibility:

Open to all individuals and groups willing to participate. Participants are encouraged to wear the headdress that they have created or obtained for the event.

Important Note: Participation in the Foot Parade automatically qualifies you for the Headdress Competition. You may only enter the Headdress Competition if you have participated in the Foot Parade, as the headdresses used during the parade will be evaluated.

Registration:

- Participants must register in advance for the foot parade and headdress competition.
- Registration will be open until October 20, 2023.

Foot Parade Route:

The foot parade will start at the Provincial Capitol Lagoon at 1:00 PM traversing the South Capitol Road (NFEFI) to Lacson Street to North Capitol Road (Seda Hotel) to Gatuslao Street and end at Ayala Malls Capitol Central Activity Center.

Headdress Competition Criteria:

A. Creativity and Uniqueness (35 points):

- · Originality and uniqueness of the headdress design.
- Creative use of organic materials that reflect the theme.
- How well the headdress stands out and captivates the audience.

B. Relevance to Theme (25 points):

- How well the headdress embodies the Southern Indigo-banded Kingfisher and Red Lauaan.
- Incorporation of colors, patterns, and elements associated with the theme.
- Effective use of organic materials to depict the theme.

C. Craftsmanship (20 points):

- Quality of construction and attention to detail.
- Precision in the execution of the headdress design.
- Effective utilization of organic materials.

D. Environmental Sustainability (15 points):

- Innovative and sustainable use of organic materials to reduce waste.
- Demonstrated effort to minimize the environmental impact of the headdress.
- Utilization of eco-friendly practices in the creation of the headdress.

D. Overall Presentation (5 points):

- The participant's ability to showcase the headdress confidently.
- Poise, posture, and stage presence during the competition.

TOTAL POINTS: 100 POINTS

"Environmental Sustainability" category to the criteria encourages participants to not only be creative but also environmentally conscious in their headdress designs. This promotes the use of organic materials that reduce waste and contribute to a more sustainable event.

Foot Parade Competition Mechanics:

Headdress Requirement:

Each participant or group must wear a headdress that complies with the Headdress Competition criteria. Headdresses should be worn throughout the parade route.

Scoring:

- The winner of the Foot Parade Competition will be determined based on the largest number of participants wearing headdresses that meet the Headdress Competition criteria.
- Judges will be present along the parade route to count participants with eligible headdresses.
- A designated official will verify participants before the parade begins and count the number of eligible headdresses.

Prizes:

- Foot Parade- First runner-up Php 5, 000, Second runner-up 3, 500, Third runner-up 2,500
- Headdress- First runner-up Php 5, 000, Second runner-up 3, 500, Third runner-up 2,500

Announcement of Winners:

Winners of both the Headdress Competition and Foot Parade Competition will be announced during the Opening Ceremony of the 19th Provincial Wildlife Month after the Sayawit Competition at Ayala Malls Capitol Central on November 6, 2023.

Disqualification:

Participants found to be in violation of any competition rules may be disqualified.

CRITERIA AND MECHANICS SAYAWIT PARA SA KALIKASAN

November 6, 2023 | Ayala Malls Capitol Central, Negros Occidental

- 1. A minimum of ten (10) to fifteen (15) participants shall perform during the contest.
- 2. Dancers and singers are considered as performers.
- 3. The performance must consist of a song and dance presentation on the environment. Participants must actually sing and dance at the same time. Any song in English, Filipino or any dialect may be used or a combination thereof may be utilized.
- 4. The presentation should last for a maximum of five minutes, in which period shall be included the introduction and the exit of the performers.
- 5. The presentation shall be stopped when the time is up.
- 6. The presentation must have environmental relevance and significance.
- 7. Props should be at the minimum only.
- 8. Only one group shall represent a school. Participants shall be limited to the first ten (10) entries who submitted their intent to join the contest. (*Please see attached confirmation slip*)
- 9. The performance shall be on November 6, 2023, 2:30 PM, at Ayala Malls Capitol Central Activity Center.
- 10. Judging shall be based on the following criteria:

Environmental Relevance/Message 30%
Voice Quality 20%
Precision of Dance Movements 20%
Originality/ Costume 20%
Projection and overall impact 10%
Total: 100%

Prizes:

Champion Php 10,000, First runner-up Php 8, 000, Second runner up Php 6,000, Third runner-up Php 4,000, Fourth runner-up Php 3,000.

18TH NEGROS OCCIDENTAL WILDLIFE QUIZ COMPETITION GUIDELINES AND MECHANICS November 10, 2023 | Cadiz City

General Guidelines

- 1. This quiz shall be open to all public and private high schools of Negros Occidental.
- 2. Each participating school shall be represented by one team of two bona fide students and one coach.
- 3. Each participating school shall be responsible for their own transportation to and from the venue.
- 4. The questions used in this quiz are based on the subjects of basic biology and ecology, Philippine and local biodiversity, biogeography and wildlife, environmental laws, and environmental issues including current events / news.
- 5. This quiz shall have three rounds, namely: Easy, Average (Elimination) and Difficult Round.
- 6. Wrong spelling is considered a wrong answer.
- 7. Answers in scientific names should be written in proper form.
- 8. Cheating in any for shall automatically disqualify a team.
- 9. In case of a tie, a tie breaker question of any difficulty and type will immediately be provided, and will be sudden death in nature. The first team to gain an advantage in score will be declared the victor of the tie.
- 10. Clarifications, questions, and protests should be addressed to the Board of Judges before the next question is asked otherwise these shall be considered void.
- 11. The decision of the Board of Judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Registration

- 1. Each school is entitled to have **two (2) representatives from the secondary level** who will compose a TEAM. They should be bona fide students of their respective schools.
- 2. The 2 students can either be: 2 junior high students, or 2 senior high students, or mixed.
- 3. Registration of participants will be made available until **October 27**, **2023**. Any changes beyond the specified dates will not be recognized. The registrants shall submit the following documents to the **PhilBio email** <u>info@philbio.org.ph</u>, to wit:
 - a. Scanned Birth Certificate or PSA of the 2 school representatives and 1 coach,
 - b. Letter from the Head of School or any relevant department heads endorsing the 2 students to represent the school for the 10th Cebu Wildlife Quiz, and
 - c. School Identification Cards of the 2 students and 1 coach.
 - d. On-site Confirmation of Registrants shall be available at the venue at 10:00 AM to 12:30 PM of November 10, 2023.

General Quiz Mechanics

- 1. Each question shall be asked by the Quiz Master and shall only be repeated twice.
- 2. All teams shall only be given 10 seconds or more for a specific question after each question to write their final answer, which must be legibly written on the board provided by the organizers.
- 3. The Quiz Master shall signal the start and end of the time period.
- 4. Students can already start answering even when the Quiz Master is not yet done in reading the statements.
- 5. Answer boards should be raised after the Quiz Master has signaled the end of the time period and should not be put down until the answer has been checked and/or verified.

Easy Round

- a. This round shall consist of 10 questions.
- b. Each correct answer will be equivalent to one (1) point.
- c. All teams will proceed to the next round.

Average (Elimination) Round

- a. All qualified teams shall begin this round with the total points each team earned during the Easy Round
- b. This round shall consist of 10 questions.

- c. Each correct answer will be equivalent to two (2) points.
- d. The teams within the top ten highest total scores at the end of this round shall qualify for the next round.

Difficult Round

- a. All qualified teams shall begin this round with the total points each team accumulated after the first two rounds.
- b. This round shall consist of 10 questions.
- c. Each correct answer will be equivalent to three (3) points.
- d. The team with the highest score at the end of this round shall be declared the Grand Champion.
- e. In case of a tie, a tie-breaker question shall be asked among the teams that are tied. The team to give the correct answer shall be the winner of the tie-breaker round. If more than two teams are tied, any team to give an incorrect answer shall immediately be dropped out of the tie-breaker
- The top three teams will also have the opportunity to represent the province in the 7th National Wildlife Quiz on 27-28 November 2023 in Ormoc City, Leyte.
