**DENGUE PREVENTION AND CONTROL AWARENESS**

To: OIC-Asst. Schools Division Superintendent  
CID & SGOD Chiefs  
Public Schools District Supervisors  
Elementary & Secondary School Heads  
All Others Concerned

1. Pursuant to Proclamation No. 1204 series 1998, which declares the month of June as the National Dengue Awareness Month, this Office shares its responsibility in ensuring the health, safety, and well-being of its learners and personnel in the delivery its mandate.
2. In line with this, everyone is encouraged to continuously implement the Enhanced 4S-Strategy which includes:
  - 1) Search and destroy mosquito-breeding sites;
  - 2) Self-protection (i.e., wearing long pants and long-sleeved shirts, and daily use of mosquito repellent);
  - 3) Seeking early consultation; and
  - 4) Support fogging/spraying only in hotspot areas in anticipation of increased infectious diseases, especially during the rainy season.
3. Furthermore, per information from the Dengue Coordinator of the City Health Office, the school may submit a written request letter addressed to the Mayor for the fogging of schools and scheduling will depend on the availability of the Fogging Team.
4. In addition, attached is the Dengue Awareness IEC material and to be distributed to the learners and parents during the distribution of the modules.
5. Expenses relative to the conduct of this activity shall be charged against the local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
6. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Memorandum are desired.

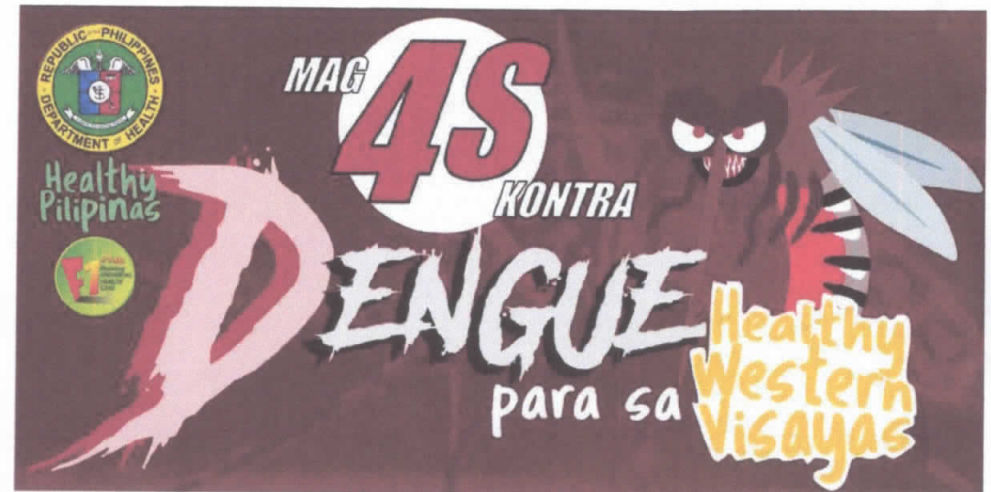


# DENGUE



- S** Search and destroy mosquito breeding places  
Suyurin at sirain ang mga pinamumugaran ng mga lamok.
- S** Self-Protection  
Sarili ay protektahan laban sa lamok.
- S** Seek early consultation  
Sumangguni agad sa pinakamalapit na pagamutan para hindi lumala ang sakit.
- S** Support fogging/ spraying only in hotspot areas
